# From the Pastor

It was on the afternoon of November 7<sup>th</sup> that Sharon and I and Grace, our two-year-old granddaughter, were driving into the parking lot of the Red Mill Commons shopping center. It had been a busy day and it was

not slowing down. I was busy driving; Sharon was busy getting ready to drop off a rug at the cleaners; and Grace was in her car seat in the back seat of the car.

Suddenly, Grace said rather matter-of-factly, "It's Christmas". Sharon and I glanced at each other as if to ask, "Why did Grace say that?" Then we both turned around to look at her. She was looking out of the back seat window. So we looked out our windows, and that's when we saw it. It was a Christmas wreath hanging from the parking lot lamp post. As we looked around we could see that Christmas decorations were already being put up throughout the parking lot.

Two things struck me from this experience. First, I was impressed that Grace was so observant to see a Christmas wreath and know what it meant. How quickly they learn! Second, I wondered why I had not been so observant to see it myself. Was I just too busy?

It is so easy to get so busy with our own agendas that we fail to see things we should see and do things we should do! Busyness gives us "tunnel vision". We can't see or hear anything else but our own selfcentered agendas. And often we miss the joys of life that surround us.

Unfortunately, this happens in our faith as well. We get too busy even for God! And then we wonder why we're so tired and frustrated; and why the world is such a violent mess!

The first Christmas was no different. Jesus was born into a world that was too busy to notice or care. Except for a few shepherds and three really observant wise men, the world took little notice of him. And the world still takes very little notice of him. We're all just too busy!

But the good news is that Christmas is still happening to those who are willing to receive it. Jesus will come and dwell in the heart of anyone who calls on his name.

The Gospel of John does not tell a nativity story, but it does give a beautiful prologue of the coming of Jesus. John writes: "Jesus came into the very world he created, but the world didn't recognize him. He came to his very own people, and even they rejected him. But to all who believed in him and accepted him, he gave the right to become children of God." (John 1:10-12, NLT)

Grace taught me a lesson that day: don't get so busy that I miss what God is doing. Christmas celebrates the truth that God sent his Son, Jesus Christ, to love me and you, and to give us his joy in life. Don't miss it! Isaac Watts wrote so powerfully, "Joy to the world, the Lord is come! Let earth receive her King."

Take a moment this Christmas season to pause long enough to see what God is doing for those who are willing to look. It may just restore the childlike joy of what Christmas is really all about – Jesus!




