From the Pastor

A **pilgrimage** is defined as “a journey, esp. a long one, made to some sacred place as an act of religious devotion.”¹ The Psalmist says, “Blessed are those whose strength is in the LORD, who have set their hearts on pilgrimage.” (Psalm 84:5) And the ancient Chinese philosopher Laozi (604-531 BCE) states: “a journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step.”²

All this to say that I am going on a pilgrimage to Israel. And I would love to invite anyone who is interested to go with me. (The bus holds 55 people.) The trip is **February 4-15, 2019**. But, the steps to begin this journey need to start now. There is an early bonus deadline of July 4, 2018.

I have been to Israel three times before. This will be my fourth trip. But this will be the first time I have been the primary host of a trip. (So please pray for me.)

We will be following a similar route to a journey that I took 8 years ago called, “Dan to Beersheba”, which is a euphemistic way of saying “*all of Israel*” (I Samuel 3:20).

Dan is in the northern part of Israel and is where we will visit Caesarea Philippi. It is also where several streams converge to form the Jordan River at the base of Mt. Hermon.

Beersheba is in the southern part of Israel, and was the city of the patriarchs. We will see the vast Negev wilderness, where the Israelites wandered before entering the promised land.

We’ll begin our journey in Jericho, one of the oldest cities in the world, and the lowest city below sea level in the world. There we will have the opportunity to renew our baptismal vows at the newly opened site where John the Baptist baptized (John 1:28)

From there we will travel south to the Dead Sea, and float in Dead Sea water. We’ll visit Masada, the fortress built by Herod the Great; and was the last stand of the Jewish Zealots in 70AD. We’ll visit Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were written.

Then we will travel north to the Sea of Galilee, where Jesus called his first disciples and did much of his teaching; and take a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. We’ll also see the newly excavated Magdala, where Mary Magdalene was from.

We’ll go to Nazareth, the home of Mary and Joseph, and the boyhood home of Jesus. Then to Megiddo, where “Armageddon” is supposed to start. We’ll follow the coast of the Mediterranean Sea to Caesarea by the Sea (and dip our toes into the sea).

We will end our journey in Jerusalem. We’ll visit Bethlehem, birthplace of our Lord. We’ll walk the Palm Sunday road from the Mount of Olives to the Garden of Gethsemane in the Kidron Valley. Finally, we will walk the Via Dolorosa to where Jesus was crucified and buried (and rose again!!) And this only some of what we will see and do.

If you are interested: 1) contact the church to get a brochure with the full itinerary and registration form. 2) Make sure you have a passport and that it is up to date. 3) Pray that the LORD will indeed bless those “*who have set their hearts on pilgrimage.*”

Kits for Conference
Full kits or bulk individual items needed
by June 3



School Kit Contents:

- One pair blunt scissors (*round tip, no plastic scissors*)
- One box of 24 crayons
- 3 One subject notebooks (*No marble composition books or 3 or 5-subject notebooks, please*)
- One pack loose-leaf paper (*100-200 pg packets; Wide or college ruled accepted*)
- One hand-held pencil sharpener (*1 inch or longer*)
- One ruler (*12 inches, should include both inches & centimeters*)
- Six unsharpened pencils
- One eraser (*2 inches or larger*)
- One 2 gallon re-sealable plastic bag for packing all items



Hygiene Kit Contents:

- One hand towel (*15 x 25 – 17 x 27 inches*)
- One washcloth
- One comb (*sturdy with at least six inches of teeth, no pocket combs or picks*)
- One toenail or fingernail clipper
- Bath-size soap (*3 oz bar or larger – not Ivory or Jergen's*)
- One adult toothbrush (*do not remove packaging*)
- 10 adhesive bandages (*3/4 by 3 inches*)
- One 1 gallon size re-sealable plastic bag for packing items.

Kit contents are very specific due to the receiving countries' requirements and for the safety and protection of eventual recipients. If items do not comply, they cannot be used. Items should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

Details: **Saturday, June 23 to Friday, June 29.** The commute is about 3.5 hours long, so if you can only make part of the week, we can make accommodations. Pastor Jack is likely coming on Sunday the 24th.

We will be staying in a Presbyterian church that has bunk beds, kitchen facilities, and shower facilities. Although specific work details are not formulated, there are plenty of projects, anything from demolition, working on an existing project, to starting a new repair.

This is another "independent" mission trip. That means we will supply our own meals, fellowship, worship and fun. There will be about eighteen youth on the trip and we need plenty of chaperones. The youth love interacting with the adults of our church, so please consider joining us for an uplifting week.

Miracles, Martyrs, Mission Accomplished

Sounds like a good mystery thriller? The best! You are invited to sign up for this intriguing 90 day journey through the New Testament, June 3-September 1, 2018. Join your Tabernacle family as we read through the New Testament in chronological order. The scriptures assigned for each day will be posted on TabernacleVB.org, in the Sunday bulletin, Friday email, Tabernacle UMC Facebook page and in this newsletter. Whether this will be your first time reading the New Testament chronologically or your tenth time, please allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you anew this summer!

Some pointers to remember as you open God's Holy Word each day.

- Pick a preferred time of day to meet with God daily in His Word
- Pray asking God to reveal Himself and speak to you personally through the daily reading of His Word.
- While there is a schedule, feel free to read ahead or take it slower as you dive into His Word. The objective is to read God's Word daily and take time to chew and digest what the Holy Spirit reveals. Consider the general meaning, the spiritual meaning and the personal meaning for you.
- Take notes, write prayers or responses to what you read and mark in your Bible highlighting scriptures that especially minister to your life as you read expecting to personally hear from God.

- If you have questions about a verse or context, call Pastor Jack or others you respect as Bible students and teachers. It is good to talk about what we are learning from God's Word with one another. The more we ask, the more we learn.

My prayer is that we all fall in love with Jesus even more this summer as we read and "chew" on His Word. God's Word is alive and sharper than a two edged sword, dividing bone and marrow. The scriptures instruct the heart and feet and the New Testament provides both historical reference and a mandate for the future. Christ's mission carries on in the life of everyone who believes and heeds the timely revelations in God's Word.

Ready....Set.....Let's Do This Together! Expecting miracles as we journey into the New Testament together!
